

COMBINED CONSUMERS SUD IS NOW INITIATING STAGE 2 DROUGHT CONTINGENCY AND WATER EMERGENCY RESPONSE PLAN.

Stage 2 measures go into effect today in efforts to reduce water use.

Combined Consumers SUD request that retail and wholesale customers implement the following water conservation strategies:

- **Customers initiate Stage 2 of their Drought Contingency Plan and Water Emergency Response Plans immediately.**
- Restrict (NO) landscape and lawn irrigation from 10 AM to 6 PM and wait until the current drought has passed before establishing new landscaping.
 - a. Irrigation of landscaped areas with hose-end sprinklers or automatic irrigation systems shall be limited to Sundays and Thursdays for customers with a street address ending in an even number (0, 2, 4, 6 or 8), and Saturdays and Wednesdays for water customers with a street address ending in an odd number (1, 3, 5, 7 or 9), and irrigation of landscaped areas is further limited to the hours 8:00 p.m. and 10:00 a.m. on designated watering days. However, irrigation of landscaped areas is permitted at anytime if it is by means of a hand-held hose, a faucet filled bucket or watering can of five (5) gallons or less, or drip irrigation system.
- Reduce water usage by 5%.
- Repair all controllable leak(s) within a reasonable period of time.
- All customers must stop hand washing cars, boats, motorbikes, trailers, or any other vehicles. (Commercial car wash only)
- All customers must stop washing sidewalks, walkways, driveways, parking lots, or any other hard-surfaced areas.
- Prohibit all Non-essential use of water like washing down sidewalks, parking lots, washing down buildings, or using water for dust control.
- Restrict (NO) water used to fill swimming pools, Jacuzzi-type pools, or wading pools.

Extending our water supply during Stage 2 through efficient use is crucial to meeting the long-term needs of all Customers.
